

BACKGROUND

The upcoming **Knowledge and Innovation Community for** Water, Marine, and Maritime **Sectors and Ecosystems (KIC** WMM), launching in 2026 under Horizon Europe and the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT), focuses on addressing the challenges of water scarcity, ecosystem degradation, and sustainable blue economy development. Knowledge and Innovation Communities (KICs) are crosssectoral partnerships integrating research, education, and business stakeholders. The KIC WMM will unite 50 partners and will receive an annual subsidy of €30 million to support services, open calls, and projects aimed at ecosystem restoration, pollution prevention, and circular blue economy practices.



MOTIVATION

The KIC WMM responds to Europe's urgent environmental crises, including climate change, biodiversity loss, and resource scarcity. By leveraging Europe's rich research, innovation, and business expertise, the KIC aims to turn knowledge into actionable solutions for global challenges. This builds on the proven success of existing KICs, such as **EIT Food** and **EIT** InnoEnergy, which have driven innovation across diverse sectors through crossdisciplinary collaboration.





KEY ACTIVITIES

The KIC WMM will tackle water and marine challenges through an interdisciplinary approach. It will focus on ecosystem restoration, addressing pollution, and developing circular economy solutions in sectors like aquaculture, sensor technologies, and biotechnologies. By promoting the economic value of ecosystem services, the KIC will integrate environmental goals into sustainable business models. The KIC will also support startups and SMEs through direct funding, open calls, and innovation programmes.
