Background and Objectives

Maritime regions are key drivers of the blue economy, leveraging their competences to foster the development and management of coastal areas, as well as to protect the marine environment and biodiversity. These regions are deeply connected to local actors and actively implement consultation and participatory processes to engage citizens and stakeholders on critical marine and coastal issues.

During the <u>PREP4BLUE</u> Atlantic Pilot Stakeholder Assembly in Bordeaux, France, the CPMR introduced the concept of 'sea parliament', a successful shared governance model already adopted by several French regions. This sparked an engaging debate on public consultation and participatory practices for sea-related issues, piloted by maritime regions. Building on this discussion, the webinar will highlight examples of shared governance models, offering inspiration and practical insights for other regions to consider for public consultation and participation purposes.

The PREP4BLUE project, part of the <u>Mission Ocean and Waters</u>, has already developed key recommendations, guidelines, and tools to support citizen and stakeholder engagement. This includes a series of webinars and a comprehensive toolbox for citizen engagement. As the project nears its completion at the end of May, this final stakeholder engagement webinar will help share PREP4BLUE's valuable results with regional authorities.

The webinar will pursue the following objectives:

- Showcase best practices of shared governance models for engaging stakeholders and citizens in marine and coastal issues;
- Offer support to regional authorities by presenting PREP4BLUE's findings on citizen engagement;
- Explore opportunities for interregional cooperation.
